Executive Director's Report – 2008 Annual General Meeting March 30, 2009

In 2008, Catholic Family Services provided professional counselling, group programming, in-home support or some combination of these services to members of 1,065 families. The following statistical information will outline for you a profile of the families served. families served:

(Please note in the Family Support Services Program 27% of the families served were two (2) parent families and 73% were one (1) parent families.)

The core services of the agency continue to be offered on a fee for service basis. All fees are on a sliding scale and are waived as necessary. In 2008, 27% of clients paid no fee; 18% paid \$25.00 or less per session; 11% paid between \$30.00 and \$65.00 per session with 44% of clients being Employee and Family Assistance Program clients.

We continue to provide service under the Employee and Family Assistance Programs. In 2008 new agreements and/or contracts are with Sykes Assistance Services Corporation, Kramer Ltd., and Norris, Penny, Myers. Employee and Family Assistance contracts continue to help supplement services to those unable to pay or those paying partial fees. In 2008 the revenue from EFAP counselling was \$12,287.00 compared to \$5,675.75 for other counselling, others being the majority of agency clients.

Fees collected for group programming is minimal. For 2008 revenue was \$390.14. Many of our groups are targeted at a vulnerable, high risk population and fees are not charged. We do not attach a cost to children's groups or groups that are funded by an external source.
